DIVISION 149-MINERAL & CRYSTAL SPECIMEN

CLASS

- 1 Open Geodes or Nodules, cut or broken not polished
- 2 California Minerals
- 3 One Crystal or One Cluster
- 4 Six Single Crystals, twinned crystals permitted
- 5 From one particular locality
- 6 Mixed display mineral-fossil-Indian artifacts or other

DIVISION 150 GENERAL LAPIDARIES

CLASS

- 1 Faceted Stones, not mounted, natural and / or synthetic material, 10 or more display claws recommended.
- 2 Faceted Stones, mounted, natural and / or synthetic material, 10 or more display
- 3 Cabochons, including free forms, mounted, variety of natural and/or synthetic material, 10 or more max 20
- 4 Cabochons, including free forms, not mounted, variety of natural and/or synthetic material, 10 or more max 20
- 5 Finished jewelry in commercial or non-commercial settings.
- 6 Any Other

DIVISION 151 EDUCATIONAL

CLASS

- 1 Minerals or crystal, educational
- 2 Artifacts, educational
