### **SPECIAL RULES:**

1. Exhibitors who drew classes in Landscape Division must have entry form in fair office on or before 4:00 p.m., Saturday Sept. 11. Any classes in those divisions not filled on Sep. 12th will be available after Monday, Sept. 13th.
2. **All exhibits must be in place by 9:00 PM on Wednesday, Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>. No Exceptions.**
3. Everyone in Horticulture area must wear closed toe shoes.
4. Aisle must be clean and level on completion of installation.
5. Each patio design exhibit and Landscape Design exhibit must be complete in itself. Exhibitors must furnish their own substructures and accessories, taking care not to obstruct other displays. Cords used to distribute power to electrical apparatus shall be rated 15 AMPS minimum and contain ground wire, and must have a GFI breaker. Cords not meeting these requirements will not be permitted. The fair will provide barriers to prevent access into exhibits.
6. All exhibits must be properly labeled (scientific and common names) for the educational value. Labeling to be on stand 3' tall, with a 12" X 14" table, and shall be securely anchored. No identification of exhibitor and chapter or club will be allowed on exhibit prior to judging. No everlasting flowers, artificial flowers or green permitted.
7. Exhibits must be built for the duration of the fair to be eligible for premium awards. Exhibits must be kept in fresh condition and each club is also responsible for the care and maintenance of its exhibits. General watering and maintenance shall be done between 6:00 to 9:00 a.m. each day; only that watering which is necessary to sustain life of plants shall be permitted during hours fair is open to the public. Exhibitors not permitted in to water with out instructor or leader or assigned adult. Exhibits not kept in fresh and functional condition will be penalized an equivalent of 10% of premium awarded each day exhibit is considered inadequate by the superintendent. Penalty fees must be paid prior to release of premium check.
8. Parents, advisors, or other adults shall ADVISE ONLY and shall not participate in construction of any exhibit. A responsible adult for each chapter or club must be present at all times during installation of design exhibits. Exhibitors found in violation will forfeit cash awards.
9. No power tools allowed, except battery operated screw drivers. This use must be supervised by an adult.
10. No jack hammers, electric shovels, rototillers, or saws
11. Each landscape spot is responsible for one time slot of security. If you fail to stand your guard duty you will be penalized 20% of premium monies.
12. If an exhibitor takes a landscape and cannot fulfill that obligation, the superintendent must be notified or that exhibitor will not be permitted to participate in the following year's landscape drawing.
13. Each exhibitor is responsible for boards on three sides and a backdrop to cover behind the landscape. No shorter than five feet, no taller than six feet.
14. No entries may be removed until the Monday after fair closes.

## INDIVIDUAL CONTAINER PLANT DIVISIONS

### SPECIAL RULES:

1. Record books for Individual Container Plant Divisions must be submitted when plants are delivered.
2. All exhibits must be properly labeled (scientific and common names)

Note to judges and exhibitors: Plants **are not** to be in black nursery containers.

They are to be presented in a clean and neat container free of weeds and debris. All plants shall be labeled, scientific & common names, for educational value. Plants shall be part of a school project and grown by the exhibitor.

### DIVISION 313 ORNAMENTAL HORTICULTURE

#### CLASS

- 1 Cacti, one variety, in 4" to 8" container. Size not to exceed 12"
- 2 Evergreen shrub, flowering, not to exceed 15-gallon container
- 3 Evergreen shrub, non-flowering, not to exceed 15-gallon container
- 4 Flowering plant, not to exceed 15-gallon container or vine
- 5 Foliage plant, indoor, in 8" to 12" container
- 6 Food producing vine, not to exceed 15-gallon container
- 7 Food producing tree, not to exceed 15-gallon container
