MEMBERS AGE 9-19

Limit: Maximum of 12 entries per exhibitor.

One entry per exhibitor of a particular type: drop cookies, bar cookies, etc. Entry form must list type of food. Exhibitor limited to entries in only one class (Beginning, Intermediate, and Advanced.) All entries must be made by exhibitor and no two exhibitors may enter food from the same batch.

MINIMUM QUANTITIES:

Muffins, biscuits, rolls, cookies and candy- ½ dozen

Cakes- ½ cake plus 1 slice

Breads- ½ loaf plus 1 slice

A mix or Styrofoam form may be used provided the shape is one which could reasonably be achieved through baking. Items are judged for decorating design only.

4-H TABLE SETTING

USE SEPARATE ENTRY FORM

- 1. Table setting must be set up by the EXHIBITOR only.
- 2. Tables only will be provided by fair. Exhibitor must provide all other materials.
- 3. Centerpiece must be made by exhibitor and may not be pre-made centerpiece from a store. Centerpiece should be as creative as possible and use color.
- 4. Menu will be judged and must be printed on a 3X5 card or in another attractive, legible manner, and must include at least one item from each food group to balance the menu.
- 5. Entry must include one place setting, centerpiece, and menu. Entry must fit on 24" X 24" space.
- 6. No waxed candles allowed. Suggest plastic or ceramic.
- 7. One entry per exhibitor

4-H FOOD PRESERVATION

USE SEPARATE ENTRY FORM

LIMIT: Maximum of 12 entries per exhibitor.

1. An entry will consist of two jars from the same canning. See 4-H Food Preservation Project outline for recommended jar size. One jar will be opened for judging and must be claimed following completion of judging.
2. Each entry is to be a different product or the same product preserved by a different method.
3. Jar labels must list type of product and process used (i.e. apricot jam, pectin method; frozen green beans, blanched one minute, and to be used within three months.)
4. Exhibitor limited to BEGINNING or ADVANCED but not both.

NOTE: Entry form must list type of product (fruit, vegetable, etc.) and the method or process used (canning or drying). Low acid foods must be canned under pressure. No paraffin seals. Canning exhibits must be in sealed jars. Dried products must be wrapped in clear plastic or in sealed jars.

Includes: non-wearable textiles and needlework, projects such as ceramic, leatherwork, macramé, crocheting, weaving and other craft projects.

Pictures and articles to be hung must be ready to hang.

An exhibit may consist of an item judged individually or a coordinated exhibit consisting of three to five items with emphasis to be on the coordination of colors, texture, patterns and shapes.

2. Exhibitor's name and address and the title of the print, division & class must appear on the back of the mount. .
3. List each print separately on one entry form. Include title of each print on entry form.
4. Public will not be allowed in judging area.
