### Voluntary Livestock Evaluation Contest

This contest is designed to be a rate of gain as well as a carcass evaluation (using the Ultrasound equipment) competition and educational program.

Livestock Evaluation is a program to provide junior exhibitors a learning experience that emphasizes all aspects of production. It is used to evaluate the total product rather than just the live animal as it appears on show day. This contest objective is to reward those exhibitors that produce an exceptional product through good selection, proficiency through healthy feeding practices and good livestock project management.

### **SPECIAL RULES FOR** **JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION**

1. Only animals that are judged "Market Ready" are eligible for JLA.
2. ORDER OF SALE: Small Animals followed by Large Animals. Dairy Heifers will be sold as near 2 p.m. as possible.
3. Donated animals will follow end of sale.
4. Scale weight will not be sale weight. Max Pay weight for animals will be as follows:
  - Beef – 1,350 lbs
  - Sheep- 160 lbs
  - Swine- 280 lbs
  - Goats- 115 lbs
5. Additional charge to the seller will be 6% of gross sale for sheep, swine, market goats, poultry, turkeys, rabbits, beef and dairy. This fund will be held in reserve to pay for loss of animals, advertising, beef and pork promotion, and any other Auction Related expense. Benefit Animals to pay same percentage rate. NOTE: It is now REQUIRED that all exhibitors selling an animal at auction have a certificate of medication signed and turned in with entry before animal may be sold. NO EXCEPTIONS. Any animal declared unfit at the time of slaughter is the responsibility of the seller and not the fair.
6. **Livestock sales will be limited to:** OVER 9 yrs of age – One large or one small animal, UNDER 9 yrs of age one small animal.  
**ALL CHAMPIONS MUST SELL**  
(Champions plus one other of a large animal species or one small with max of 3 animals unless an exhibitor has more than 3 champs)
  - a. Sale of Dairy replacement heifer is in addition to the above.
  - b. All champions and reserve champion animals must be sold.
  - c. All exhibitors going through auction must have their picture taken by Friday October 14<sup>th</sup> 12 p.m.
7. All animals will be presented in the auction in a well-groomed condition. All exhibitors must wear official uniform of organization they represent when in sale ring. **NO GLITTER OR WRITING OF ANY KIND ALLOWED ON ANY ANIMAL.** Disqualification will result.
8. All animals entering sale ring will be sold if they receive an opening bid of not less than the buy back for that type of animal. Exhibitors who do not wish to sell at the auction must notify the livestock office in writing no later than Thursday, October 13<sup>th</sup>, 3:00 PM. NO EXCEPTIONS. If you do not notify management as to which animal you will be taking through the auction, management will make the choice and if you do not agree you will have to withdraw from the sale completely.
9. Exhibitor must be present and ready when called to line up for the sale. Unless exhibitor, parent or leader contacts livestock superintendent prior to being called the exhibitor will forfeit right to sell animal.
10. All animals must be fed, watered and haltered and have bedding until they are loaded out. Halters must be left on all beef cattle. If you want your halter back please tag with your name and club. Every effort will be made to return it to you.

4. First place award winner in each level are eligible to advance to Master-showmanship.

This contest is open to the first place winners in all 4-H/Grange and FFA Showmanship classes. Each exhibitor must show Beef, Sheep, Swine, Market Goat, Dairy Cattle, and Dairy Goat. 1<sup>st</sup> Place winners must represent that species. We will offer four Market Master Showmanship Competitions in the Market Show – one for 4-H/Grange senior competitors; one for 4-H/Grange junior competitors, one for Novice FFA, and one for Advanced FFA competitors.

The 1st place winner, of each of the 4-H Senior, Junior Classes, Novice FFA, and FFA Advanced, in each specie, will be given the opportunity to compete in the Master Showmanship Contest. Each specie contest winner must declare to the Livestock Office, by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, May 17th, his or her intentions of competitions. If their intentions are not declared the Livestock Office will offer the next placed specie contestant

Danish System of Judging

After weighing, market lambs will be divided into weight lots for convenience in judging.

NOTE: Market sheep are wethers and ewes only. Must show lambs teeth.

No more than 1-inch stretched wool on animals. Should be slick shorn prior to being weighed. All lambs will be checked off the trailers for compliance of teeth, wool fungus, sore mouth and tail docking rule according to California Divisions of Fairs and Expositions State Rules.

**GRADE:**

**MARKET READY:** USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12<sup>th</sup> rib back fat range .16-.35, average or greater conformation and cut ability.

**NOT MARKET READY:** Good or lower quality grade with 12<sup>th</sup> rib back fat range <.16 or >.35; under-finished lambs grading USDA good or lower, below-average conformation or cut ability.

Danish System of Judging

1. Evidence of dehorning must be present.  
No longer than 1" Scur
2. Must be shown with kid's teeth.
3. After weighing, market goats will be divided into weight lots for judging.

NOTE: Market Goats are Wethers and Does Only.

GRADE:

MARKET READY: USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12<sup>th</sup> rib back fat range .08-12 most desirable, .13-.22 back fat acceptable, average or greater conformation and cutability.

NOT MARKET READY: Good or lower quality grade with 12<sup>th</sup> rib back fat range <.08 or >.22; under finished goats grading USDA good or lower, below average conformation or cutability.
